FEBRUARY IS A BUSY MONTH FOR SENIORS AND JUNIORS!

February means that scholarship season is in full swing for seniors. Show your family some love by applying for as many scholarships as possible to help pay for college! Juniors should already be prepping for the March SAT test; the higher your score, the easier college and scholarship applications will be!

Paying for College

Fears about paying for college is the number one factor facing students and parents when they are talking about plans after high school. However, there are many resources available to high school students at every grade level to help alleviate those fears.

RaiseMe Micro Scholarships

Beginning in the 9th grade, students can create a free account with RaiseMe (available as a free app). Students connect their account to colleges around the country, then add achievements like good grades, extracurriculars, and volunteer work to their profile. Based on these achievements, colleges will start putting money in an account for you to use if you

choose to attend that college.

Naviance Scholarships

Naviance, available to students and parents, has a list of scholarships that have been vetted by people who work in LCISD and scholarships offered by local groups. Click "Colleges", "Scholarships and Money", then "Scholarship List." You can filter scholarships by grade level and other options. There are at least four scholarships currently available for underclassmen.

Grants

It's not too late to apply for grant money for college! Students who have a social secutiry number are eligible to apply for FAFSA, the federal grant program.



Students who have a DACA social security number or no social security number can apply for TASFA, the state grant program. For both programs, students will need the 2017 income tax return documents in order to complete the application.

A: On the Naviance Transcript Request
Manager page, scroll down to "Additional
Transcript Requests" and fill out the form. If you would
like to pick up your official transcript, you may enter that
information in the "Other Notes" section, otherwise your
transcript will be mailed directly to the scholarship group.

Juniors take the SAT at school on March 9, 2019!

To be considered college ready, students must score at least a 480 on the reading and writing section of the SAT and a 530 on the math section. On the ACT, students need at a composite score of 23 with at least a 19 in English and a 19 in math. Students who do not get these scores on the SAT or ACT will take the TSI Assessment. Students must make at least a 351 on the reading section, 350 on the math section, and a 340 on the writing section with at least a 4 on the essay. Without these scores, students will be required to take remedial English and/or math classes when they start college. <u>These are classes that you have to pay for, but do not count toward your degree!!!</u> Don't let this happen to you! Make sure you have the tools to succeed on the SAT, ACT, or TSI test.
